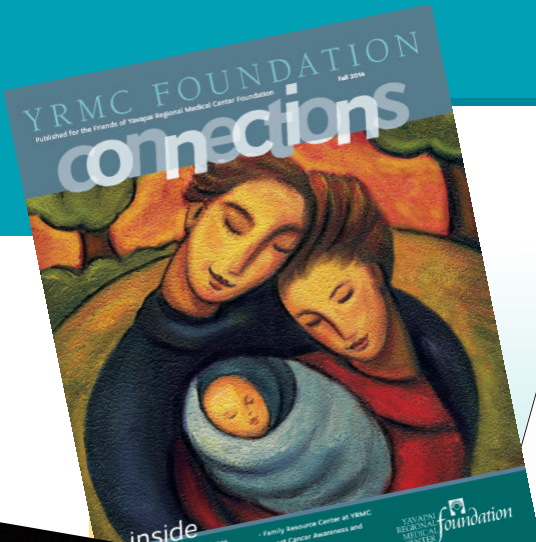

A Legacy Born from Community Spirit

This year, the YRMC Foundation proudly marks its 25th anniversary – a quarter-century dedicated to elevating healthcare in Yavapai County. Our story, however, truly began long before 2001.

Flashes of that founding spirit emerged as early as 1948, when Prescott, a town of just 6,000, faced a financial hurdle for its Community Hospital: a \$400 deficit preventing the introduction of modern anesthesia. It was then that local donors first rallied, recognizing healthcare as a shared responsibility. This initial success galvanized the Yavapai County Medical Auxiliary, led by the indefatigable Jean Phillips (top left). Jean and her group launched annual charity balls, laying the philanthropic groundwork for what would become Yavapai Regional Medical Center

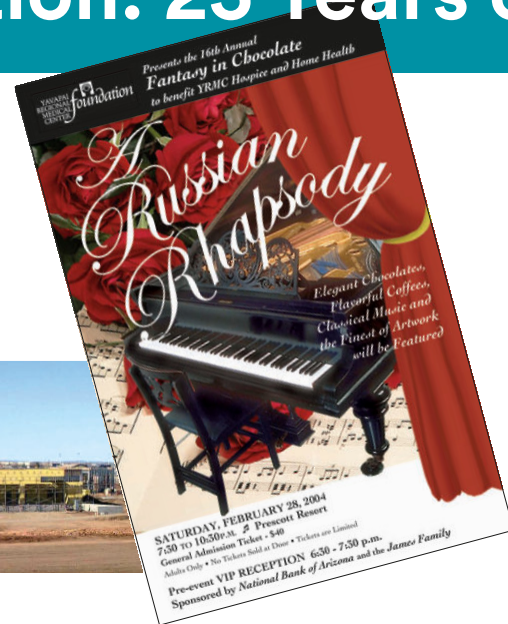


spearheaded by Robbie Nicol, who joined YRMC as Development Director from John C. Lincoln Hospital in Phoenix.

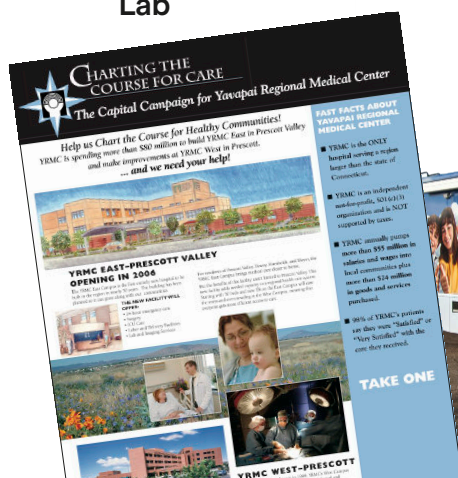

Shaping exceptional nurses

Two years ago, a vision emerged: to transform existing resources and secure new ones into a cutting-edge onsite nurse training center. That vision is now a reality: our recently launched Nursing Simulation Lab. We're delighted to provide an update on this exciting project, which is already profoundly impacting skill development for YRMC nurses.



Under the expert leadership of Stacey McCarter, Simulation Education Specialist, the lab offers a realistic, immersive training environment. Here, nurses refine their skills in

evidence-based practices such as intubation, port installation, catheter insertion, sterile techniques, birthing scenarios, and central line (PICC) placement. This comprehensive training ensures our RNs are fully capable and ready for the patient floor.

The YRMC Foundation was proud to provide critical funding for the Lab and

the first year of the Simulation Education Specialist position. Stacey's leadership has been instrumental, resulting in the seamless integration of the program into our New Nurse Residency Program, alignment of workflows and processes with larger Dignity Health facilities across Arizona, activation of high-fidelity simulation and recording systems to enhance debriefing quality for nursing simulations, and the initiation of accreditation preparation through the Society for Simulation in Healthcare.



Stacey shares, "I'm incredibly excited to see how this program continues to grow. Our entire Nursing Education team has been instrumental and incredibly supportive in bringing this project to fruition. We are immensely grateful for donor support to the Nursing Education Fund, which made this vital initiative a reality. Our Nursing Simulation Lab is pivotal in developing the highest quality nurses right from the start."

Expanding capacity to help the journey to recovery

Thanks to donor support for our Community Care Fund (Area of Greatest Need), the YRMC Foundation enabled the purchase of updated exercise equipment for our Del E. Webb Outpatient Rehab Center at the Prescott Valley campus and our Iron Springs facility near the Prescott Campus to accommodate increased patient volume and maximize best practice interventions. The equipment includes a traction table,

recumbent bike, upper body exerciser, treatment tables, pulley systems, gym tower, parallel bars, and more.

As two-time recipients of the Press Ganey Guardian of

Excellence Award which recognizes top-performing healthcare organizations that have achieved the 95th percentile of higher for patient experience, YRMC leadership recognizes the important of meeting growing local demand for rehabilitation services. “We’re excited about this expansion and the opportunity to better serve our community,” says Richard Logan, PT, Director of Physical Rehabilitation Services for YRMC. “The new center will enable us to provide more services starting with physical therapy, which constitutes the majority of our referrals.”

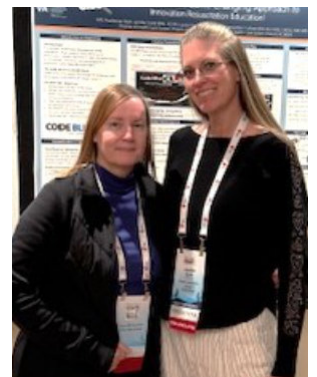
Skill building to increase patient survival

Jennifer Scott, YRMC nurse educator, attended the Cardiac Arrest Survival Summit (CASS) in December, an international conference dedicated to improving sudden cardiac arrest survival through science, education, and community action.

The four-day summit united clinicians, educators, and researchers to share emerging evidence and strengthen resuscitation practices. Sessions focused on high-quality CPR, team optimization, post-cardiac arrest care, community initiatives, and training innovations, presenting both research advances and practical solutions. The event also fostered valuable networking.

In collaboration with Jacqueline Cushard, President of Simulation for Arizona, Jennifer presented an interactive educational activity designed to reinforce rapid recognition, critical decision-making, and effective communication during cardiac emergencies for both clinical and non-clinical staff, demonstrating the power of gamified learning for high-stakes concepts. Out of several presentations made, their activity received the highest possible rating from the 87 attendees.

Jennifer stated, “CASS offered valuable insights, practical strategies, and a strong sense of shared purpose in



improving cardiac arrest survival. It underscored the importance of innovative education, interdisciplinary collaboration, and ongoing quality improvement in strengthening clinical readiness and saving lives.” Many thanks to our donors for supporting these crucial learning opportunities.



Unlocking better respiratory outcomes

The YRMC Foundation recently funded new Masimo EMMA® EtCO₂ capnography units for the Respiratory Therapy department. These

devices provide accurate, immediate, and noninvasive measurements of end-tidal carbon dioxide and respiration rate.

In collaboration with YRMC’s Code Blue responders (cardiac or respiratory arrest), it was recognized that the current EtCO₂ monitoring equipment was bulky, expensive and challenging to use at CPR events in the hospital. The committee agreed that the compact and portable EMMA® EtCO₂ devices are ideal for emergency, transport, and ICU settings, offering real-time feedback for patient safety.

Scott Cerreta, Director of Respiratory Care, noted, “Adding EMMA devices to all YRMC code carts significantly improves critical monitoring during CPR events. This evidence-based practice confirms CPR quality and predicts cardiac arrest survivability.”

A Turning Point for Opioid Recovery

In the Emergency Department (ED), urgent moments and high emotions accompany crisis. For those with opioid use disorder (OUD), an ED visit can be a turning point, not just another revolving door. Yavapai County faces significant opioid challenges, ranking high in hospitalizations, ED visits, overdose deaths, and misuse rates.

YRMC’s Medication for Opioid Use Disorder (MOUD) program initiates treatment in the ED. When a patient is ready for recovery, providers offer immediate support, understanding, and hope. Patients receive a 7-day medication to manage cravings and withdrawal without euphoria. During this critical time, a Community Health Worker (CHW) like YRMC’s John Gibson (left) facilitates a “warm handoff” in the ED. John, a retired firefighter and volunteer chaplain, builds trust, identifies treatment facilities with the patient, and coordinates ongoing medication management.



Recognizing that medical care alone isn’t enough, our CHWs assess the full picture: housing, transportation, food security, and financial barriers. Through strong community partnerships, we connect patients to local organizations, ensuring holistic recovery support—medical, social, and structural.

We focus on the most vulnerable by offering dignity, arranging

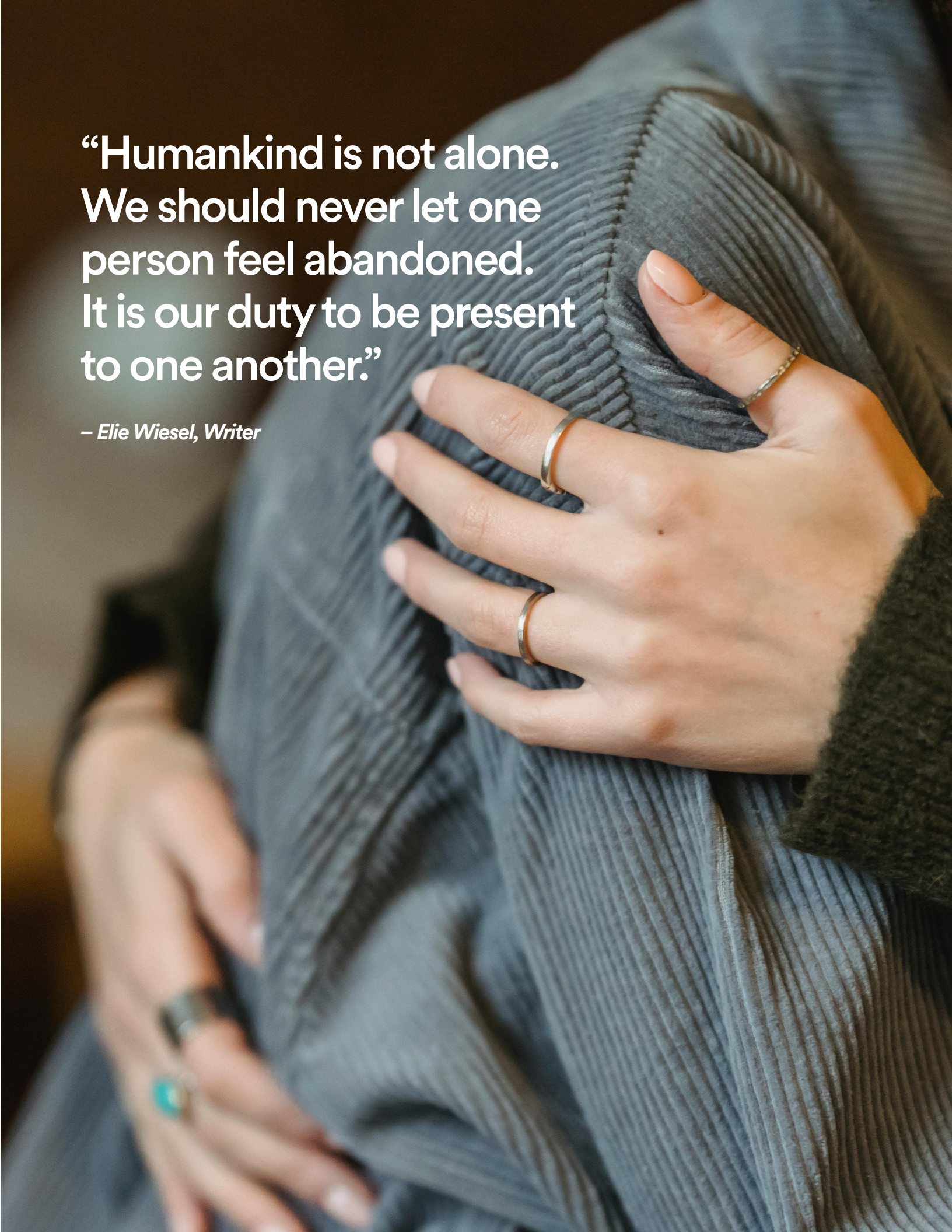
