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Ensuring Older Adults Lead Vibrant and Fulfilling Lives

A lost set of keys...a missed dental appointment...forgetting the name of an acquaintance - these may be signs of normal aging. Coupled with other symptoms, however, they may also signal the start of dementia or other conditions that early-on could be mistaken for dementia – amyotrophic lateral sclerosis, depression, Parkinson's disease or even a small stroke.

These "neurocognitive conditions" all affect a person's ability to think and reason. Accurately diagnosing a neurocognitive condition requires a comprehensive evaluation by a multidisciplinary team of healthcare experts. Today, thanks in large measure to funding support provided by the YRMC Foundation, this important service is now available in our community through YRMC's Cognitive Assessment and Support Clinic.

"We are so very grateful for the Foundation's steadfast support and encouragement throughout the course of the Clinic's development and implementation," said Clinic Director, Dr. Sam Downing. "In my work I've found that as people age, they want to be fully engaged in life both physically and mentally. They want a quality of life that endures. Supporting that goal is the overarching purpose of our Cognitive Assessment and Support Clinic."



Thanks to funding support provided by the YRMC Foundation, YRMC's Cognitive Assessment and Support Clinic and Alzheimer's and Dementia Care Program are now available in our community.

Helping patients and their families with the complex medical, behavioral and social needs of Alzheimer's disease and other types of dementia is the work of the Clinic's companion initiative, the Alzheimer's and Dementia Care Program. Also supported with Foundation funds, the program goals are 1) to maximize patient function, independence and dignity; 2) minimize caregiver strain and burnout; and 3) to reduce unnecessary care cost through improved care.

In Continuous Pursuit of Patient Care Excellence at the James Family Heart Center

Breaking News – YRMC's Chief of Staff, Dr. Pierre Tibi, recently announced the James Family Heart Center's participation in the internationally recognized Enhanced Recovery After Surgery (ERAS) Cardiac Society. According to Dr. Tibi, the Society's sole focus is to improve patient care. "Implementing the Society's evidence-based best practices, our goals at YRMC are better and earlier recovery after cardiac surgery, reduction in complications and length of stay, fewer readmissions and lower cost," said Tibi.

Under Dr. Tibi's leadership, YRMC has established an ERAS Cardiac committee comprised of representatives from more than 25 clinical specialties. The committee is utilizing ERAS Cardiac evidence-based best practices to develop and implement local protocols. Funded through your support of the James Family Heart Center, YRMC's ERAS committee will conduct ongoing clinical staff education sessions, host ERAS

expert-led seminars, and continuously monitor patient outcomes data and patient care satisfaction.
